Net price: This is the average price that the typical family in each income range actually pays after grants and scholarships are subtracted. Please be aware that this is an average and your net price is likely to be different-sometimes drastically different. Net price is in essence the cost of attendance minus the average amount of scholarships and

grants. Most families will pay the net price with some combination of savings and investments, current income, and various loans. Some students will also receive scholarships from outside sources. Any scholarships and grants from the college itself as well as state and federal grants are included in the data.

Total Cost: Total cost in the data tables is the total cost of attendance for that particular institution for the 2014-15 school year. This would include tuition and fees (in-state tuition for public colleges), room and board, books, and other expenses (travel and personal expenses).

This table is the averages of the data on the opposite side. The 13 University of Wisconsin Schools were averaged together and the 13 private colleges were also averaged together.

Notice that the average private college is \$7000-\$10,000 more than the average

UW School. It is important to stress that these are averages. Most families will not be average and their individual circumstances could be drastically different. I would encourage all families to work with the colleges that are on their list to get information specific to their situation.

Average net price by income for full-time beginning undergraduate students who paid the in-state or in-district tuition rate and were awarded Title IV aid.

Beginning students are those who are entering post secondary education for the first time.

Title IV aid to students includes grant aid, work study aid, and loan aid. These include: Federal Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG), Academic Competitiveness Grant (ACG), National Science and Mathematics Access to Retain Talent Grant (National SMART Grant), Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant, Federal Work-Study, Federal Perkins Loan, Subsidized Direct or FFEL Stafford Loan, and Unsubsidized Direct or FFEL Stafford Loan. For those Title IV recipients, net price is reported by income category and includes students who received federal aid even if none of that aid was provided in the form of grants. While Title IV status defines the cohort of student for which the data are reported, the definition of net price remains the same – total cost of attendance minus grant aid.
