Pewaukee Summer School Terms/Agreements

By enrolling in Pewaukee School District's summer school program, you agree to the following terms and guidelines.

PEWAUKEE PUBLIC SCHOOLS STUDENT NETWORK (INCLUDING INTERNET) USE PROCEDURES

The Pewaukee Public Schools believes that knowledge of technology and electronic information is fundamental to learning. The District encourages reasonable access to various information formats and believes it is incumbent upon users of this technology to avail themselves of this privilege in an appropriate and responsible manner.

EDUCATIONAL PURPOSE

Access to the technology in the Pewaukee Public Schools has been established for educational purposes. All school computer network accounts must be used in support of the educational objectives of the District. You are responsible for anything sent on the network with your name on it. The use of the Pewaukee Public Schools network is a privilege, not a right, which may be revoked at any time for abusive or inappropriate conduct.

***You are expected to abide by the acceptable policy of network usage including but not limited to the following:

LEGAL USE OF NETWORK

- All illegal activities are strictly forbidden including accessing or transmitting obscene, abusive, sexually explicit, or threatening language or materials.
- Students may not load software/applications onto district computers.
- Students may not copy commercial software for use by friends.
- Students may not copy software from the Pewaukee Public Schools computers for any reason.

APPROPRIATE LANGUAGE

• Appropriate language must be used in all private and shared documents.

PRIVACY AND PERSONAL INFORMATION

- Do not reveal your name, address, phone number, etc. or personal information of your friends to anyone.
- Under no circumstances should a personal password/account be provided to another person.
- You may not use an account other than your own nor misrepresent your identity.

SOFTWARE

• All software (networked and non-networked) must be loaded by and stored with the Technology Coordinator.

EQUIPMENT

- It is unacceptable to relocate computers, add or remove peripherals, remove any cords or connections, or dismantle a computer in any way.
- The principal must give permission prior to students bringing computer hardware into the district for special projects.
- Students and their parents/guardians will be responsible for any damage and will be held responsible for the replacement of parts or technician time to correct that which has been altered or destroyed.

MANAGEMENT

- Pewaukee Public Schools reserves the right to monitor all District technology. The District also reserves the right to search Internet accounts accessed with school equipment without permission if it is felt that illegal or otherwise inappropriate use of the technology is occurring.
- Improper use of the District's technology, including the Internet, will result in fines, loss of network privileges, suspension or expulsion as deemed appropriate.

Advance Board Games (grades 5-8)

Hip Kids (grades 1-2, 3-4)

Discover the funky moves of hip hop while learning combinations. Students will experience and learn the latest moves and age appropriate music and routines!

Internet Central (grades 1-2, 3-4)

Students will be introduced to Google Chrome and learn how to safely search Google. Students will also be introduced to a variety of websites that will help them with their math, literacy, coding, and typing skills.

Intro to Programming (3-5, 6-8)

This course aims to teach introductory concepts of programming through Code.org. Topics in the class include sequencing, loops, binary, functions and variables. No prior experience is required.

iRUN (grades 3-4, 5-6) For Girls

iRUN is a **running** club open to 3rd - 5th grade **girls** to promote a healthy body image, teach training practices, and encourage teamwork among fellow peers. The time together will consist of stretching routines, a run outside as a group (some runs will be off-campus) and a community circle to end. If weather does not allow for outside running, we plan to do an alternate exercise routine.

Students will collaborate with peers to build structures and complete a series of challenges throughout this course using MinecraftEdu. Small guided reading groups, word study and response journals will be part of the daily lessons. The newly formatted class is open to all learners. Keep your summer brain energized!

Reading Scavenger Hunt (grades 1-2, 3-4)

Students will be given a "map" with different reading challenges. Some of the challenges will include "Read a story about a place you'd like to visit" or "Read a story while lying in the grass". Students will have an opportunity to discover what they like to read as well as how they like to read. They will be introduced to a variety of different types of stories (poetry, non-fiction, short stories, etc..) and will get to choose which stories stand out to them. The scavenger hunt will last through the two weeks of class, ending with a celebration on the last day to discuss favorite stories from the class!

Rocketry (grades 3-4, 5-8)

Blast off as you investigate the history of rocket travel. Then use your knowledge as you design and launch your very own rocket!

Scrapbooking (grades 3-4, 5-8)

High School For Credit Class Offerings

For-credit classes are five weeks in length. Classes meet June 14-July 23, Off July 5-9 (5weeks) Attendance is mandatory for successful course completion. Only one absence is allowed. The following courses may be taken for credit-only.

Personal Fitness and Wellness (Grades 9-12)

Fee \$0

Personal Fitness & Wellness allows students to individually improve their personal fitness and overall wellness. Students engage in cardio, strength, and core activities in the Fitness Center. Beneficial nutrition information and tips to promote a healthy lifestyle will be provided. This class offers a more personalized learning environment for students who would like to get into shape, lose calories, tone up and track improvements. It provides an alternative to sport activities and a "health club" environment. Track workouts, circuit stations, wellness walking, heart rate monitors, and exercise videos will be a part of the workouts in this class. Self motivation and self-evaluation are essential attributes needed for this course. Physical fitness tracking and improvements will also be a component of this class.

This class will be offered on a Pass/Fail Basis and will run from 10:00am-12:30pm in person T and TH each week. Students will participate virtually M, W and F.

Health (Grades 9-12)

Fee \$0

Health education is a student centered course providing participants with the knowledge and skills necessary to make healthy life choices for today and into the future. Within each unit, emphasis is placed on total health to include physical, mental and social well-being. Individual coursework encourages students to analyze and evaluate their personal health behaviors, how they impact their well-being and use that to promote health and wellness in their everyday lives. Units of study include: wellness, mental-emotional health, alcohol and drug prevention, certification in CPR/AED and first aid, nutrition and human growth and development. NOTE: Information about the human growth and development unit will be provided at the start of the course. A parent/guardian signature is required to remove their child from this unit. Students who do not participate in the human growth and development unit will complete an independent study on health related topics to be determined by the instructor. This class will be offered on a Pass/Fail Basis and will run from 7:30am-10:00am. Students will be in person 4 days a week and 1 day will be virtual. **Most likely a M or F will be virtual**

High School Credit-Recovery

Credit Recovery classes are five weeks in length. Classes meet June 21-July 30, Off July 5-9 (5weeks) Attendance is mandatory for successful course completion. Only one absence is allowed. The following courses will be offered.

Math Credit Recovery Workshop

This course is reserved for students who were unsuccessful in coursework during the normal school year. Students will be required to come to school to work 5 days per week, 2 hours per class. Students will have the ability to make up .5 credits in each section. Students will work in a small group setting to reach course proficiency. The following Math classes can be taken for credit recovery:

Algebra 1 Semester 1 and Semester 2
Algebra 2 Semester 1 and Semester 2
Geometry Semester 1 and Semester 2
Transition to Geometry Semester 1 and Semester 2

Social Studies Credit Recovery Workshop

This course is reserved for students who were unsuccessful in coursework during the normal school year. Students will be required to come to school to work, 5 days per week, 2 hours per class. Students will have the ability to make up .5 credits in each section. Students will work in a small group setting to reach course proficiency. The following Social Studies classes can be taken for credit recovery:
